Her current emphasis is on incorporating wellness through music into the hospital setting and surgery especially, as well as into everyday life. In 2008, Dr. Cash received a U.S. Patent for her process of choosing music especially for surgery in order to reduce the amount of medications and anesthesia required, thus contributing to a safer surgical experience and a faster recovery.

Since 1990, Dr. Cash has been conducting research on the healing power of music. From 1990 to 1997 she was Coordinator of Music and Medicine at the University of Louisville School of Medicine. Her research included "Psychopysicological Benefits of Tone and Chant" and "Therapeutic Use of Music with Alzheimer's Patients,"

In the Fall of 2010, the V.A. Hospital in Louisville, KY will conduct a research study on her "Surgical Serenity Headphones." Dr. Cash was on the staff of Baptist Hospital East in Louisville, KY. She maintains a clinical private practice in Louisville, KY.

PERFORMER

Dr. Cash has been presenting concerts, recitals and music workshops since 1970. She has studied in the United States and in Europe with masters such as Lee Luvisi, Edward Kilenyi, and Ilonka Deckers. In 1986 she began a series on women in music, focusing on Wanda Landowska and the Revival of the Harpsichord. As a result, Dr. Cash won a prestigious Kentucky Foundation for Womengrant which took her to Paris to conduct research on the life and work of Landowska. Her dissertation has been made into an award-winning documentary on Landowska, premiered at the Boston Early Music Festival.

THERAPIST/CLINICIAN

Dr. Cash is a licensed clinical social worker, providing services to individuals, families, and groups. She uses a varied therapeutic approach combining her extensive knowledge of music with an understanding of mind-body medicine. She has garnered a national reputation as one of the few clinical musicologists in the country.

Her current research is focused on music with surgery and music with childbirth including mother-baby bonding. She also sees patients suffering from Alzheimer's disease, Parkinson's disease and other disorders.

Dr. Cash has taught music performance and history, clinical social work, and music healing at the University of Louisville School of Music, the U of L School of Medicine, and the U of L Kent School of Social Work.
